The Indian Qualifying Rounds will see participation of more than 25 teams from law universities across India, and 3 finalist team will proceed to international rounds which is held annually at The Hague, Netherlands.

The ICC Moot encourages students to study the working of the International Criminal Court, which becomes extremely pertinent in the current global context.

The 2017 ICC Moot problem deals with the issues of genocide, exclusion of criminal responsibility of involuntary child soldiers and the competence to accept the ICC's jurisdiction.
