Our Logo

The logo of NLU Delhi is composed of 3 elements: n (N), l (L) and u (U) which are interlinked by the second element L. In its totality, it represents the harmonious confluence of disparate elements (disciplines) and levels- a rule that Law and its executive, the judicial system also performs. Individually, the 'N' and 'U' are downward and upward facing respectively, symbolizing polar (and complementary) outlooks through which Law threads its way. The extension of L or Law beneath the level (layer) attempts to encapsulate the concerns of equality and social justice. The emphasis is on the 'Rule of Law' (represented by the L) in promoting social justice, particularly targeting the vulnerable population, which is lowest on the social ladder. Its columnar arrangements suggest an upholding of justice, equality, fraternity and human rights in all their facets to reach a secular democracy.

Vision

NLU Delhi follows a mandate to transform and redefine the process of legal education. The University aims to evolve and impart comprehensive and interdisciplinary legal education, which will promote legal and ethical values, while fostering the rule of Law. National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF)

National Law University Delhi has once again secured the 2nd position in the Law Category of the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) Rankings 2025. This marks the 8th consecutive year that NLU Delhi has retained this esteemed position.

The NIRF is a ranking system for higher education institutions in India which assesses HEIs on five parameters: Teaching, Learning and Resources (TLR), Research and Professional Practice (RP), Outreach and Inclusivity (OI), Graduation Outcomes (GO) and Perception (PR). It is released every year by the Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India.

Dr. Garima Tiwari, Ph.D from the University of Camerino, Italy, specializes in the domestic effects of international law. Her academic background includes an LLM from the University of Torino and a Master's in Intellectual Property Law from Indira Gandhi National Open University, India. She is a post-doctoral research fellow at South Ural State University, Russia, and previously served as Associate Professor at Bennett University. Dr. Tiwari has contributed to international legal collaborations and conducted research projects as a Senior Researcher with Lexidale-International Policy Consulting. She co-founded AContrario International Criminal Law and has offered lectures and workshops internationally, focusing on human rights and legal protections in India. Dr. Tiwari's accolades include research grants on transgender rights and awards for her efforts in promoting legal awareness in various domains. At NLU Delhi, she teaches Legal Methods and International Human Rights Law to students.

Dr. Tasneem Deo teaches criminal law, criminology, and sociology. Her research focuses on the study of the criminal justice institutions of the police, courts, and prisons using socio-legal methods. She is committed to conducting field-work based assessments of the functioning of these institutions and providing solutions for the challenges they face, including drafting legislative amendments, restructuring of stakeholder incentive structures, and capacity building. In pursuance of the same, she has worked closely with the National Commission for Women, Bureau of Police Research and Development, and State of Karnataka on aspects of police-public relations, victimisation of women in the cyber-space, and gender diversity in policing. She is currently working on a project pertaining to the decriminalisation of industrial laws under the mandate of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, State of Chhattisgarh. Dr. Deo's doctoral research at Yale Law School, supervised by Professor Tom Tyler, was on the impact of gender on judicial decision making studied through an analysis of data collected from criminal appeals heard at the High Court of Delhi.

She has previously been a researcher at the University of Antwerp, Belgium, assigned to work by NLU Delhi as a part of the Ministry of Education's SPARC Project on Law, Gender and Sustainable Development. She has also served as a resource person for lectures on women and

legal rights at the University of Udaipur's UGC Centre for Women Studies.

Dr. Saumya's work has appeared in various prestigious journals and edited books, including Lexis Nexis and Routledge publications. She has presented her work at a number of national and international conferences and other platforms across North America, Europe and Southeast Asia. 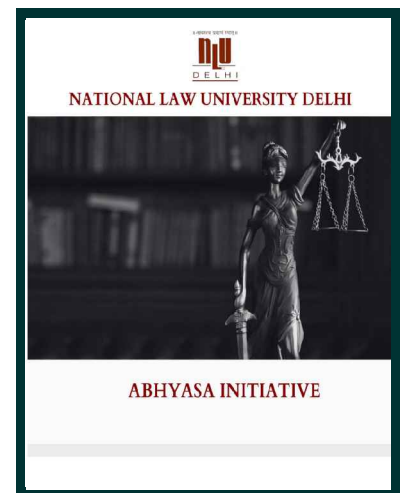
Dr. Sidharth Dahiya

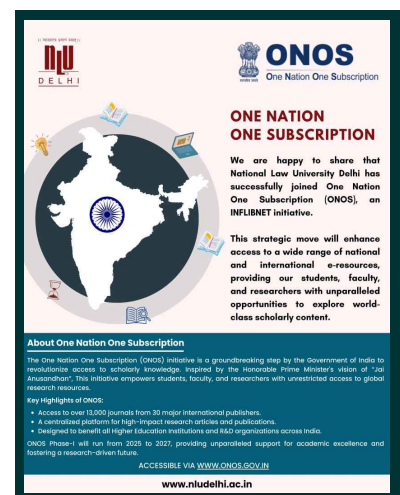
1. Abhyasa Initiative

The NLU Delhi Abhyasa Initiative will seek to bring in experiences of practitioners and professionals in respective areas (except seminar courses) by way of assigning specific topics which delve on the practical aspects of the subject. Practical aspects such as filing/drafting applications, understanding specific rules and procedure, technical/scientific dimension which are important from an evidentiary/factual perspective in litigation, special court procedures (if any) that are adopted to resolve disputes, drafting exercises etc. which are closely aligned with the subject may be undertaken.



2. One Nation One Subscription (ONOS)

We are happy to share that National Law University Delhi has successfully joined One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) an INFLIBNET initiative; this strategic move will enhance access to a wide range of national and international e-resources. The Prime Minister of India in his address to the Nation from the ramparts of the Red Fort on 15th August, 2022, had pointed out the importance of Research and Development in our country in the Amrit Kaal. He had given the clarion call of "Jai Anusandhan" on the occasion. The Government of India approved One Nation One Subscription scheme to provide country-wide access to international high impact scholarly research articles and journal publications to students, faculty and researchers of all Higher Education Institutions managed by the central government and state governments and Research & Development Institutions of the central government. From 1st January 2025, ONOS phase-I has been approved for the calendar years 2025, 2026 and 2027. Access to journals is being provided through national subscription coordinated by the Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre. The One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) initiative provides access to over 13,000 journals from 30 major international publishers.



NEW ADMINISTRATIVE INITIATIVES

The University administration consistently undertakes various initiatives to enhance institutional efficiency, academic excellence, and overall service delivery. These initiatives focus on strengthening governance mechanisms, streamlining administrative processes, promoting transparency, and ensuring the effective implementation of policies and programs. 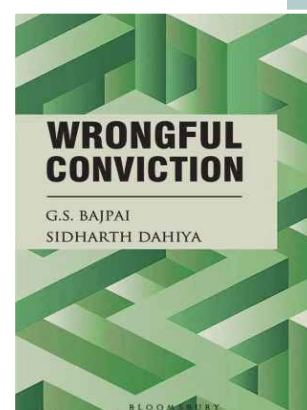

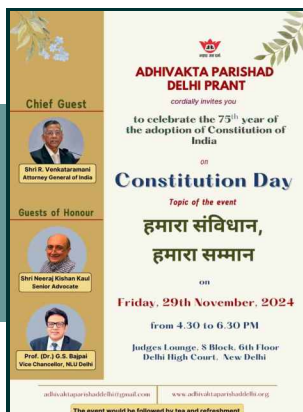

21. 29th Annual Debate Competition of Central Armed Police Forces (December 13, 2024)

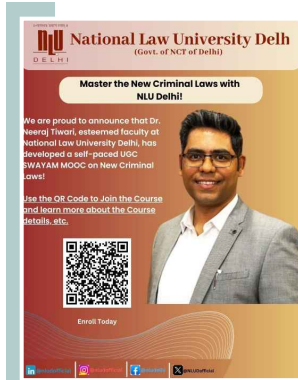

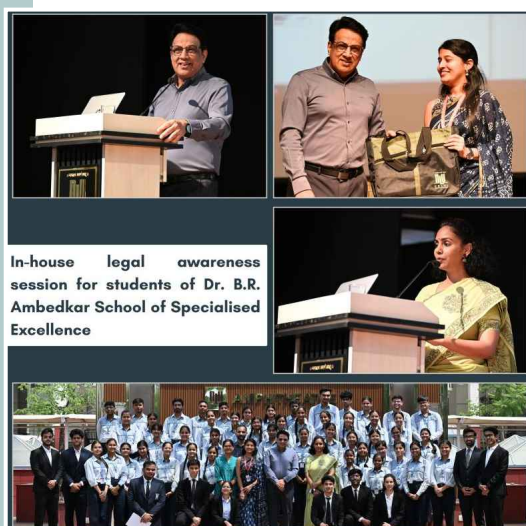
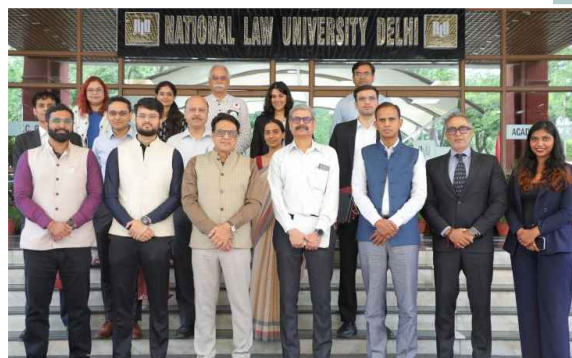
62. Inaugurating the Certificate Course on Real Estate Project Management and Financing (May 3, 2025)

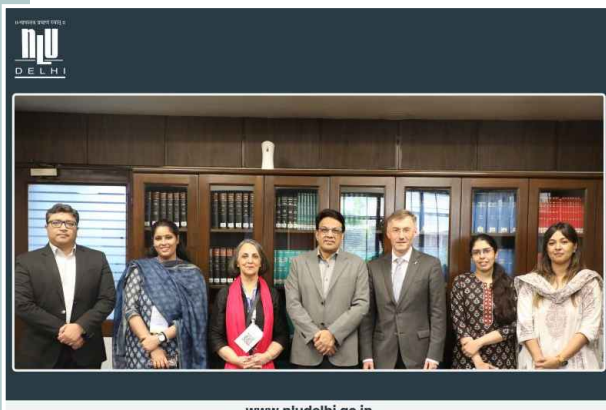
students had the opportunity to engage with the delegation, gaining invaluable insights into the future of intellectual property.

2. Student Well-being & Mental Health Workshop (October 15, 2024)

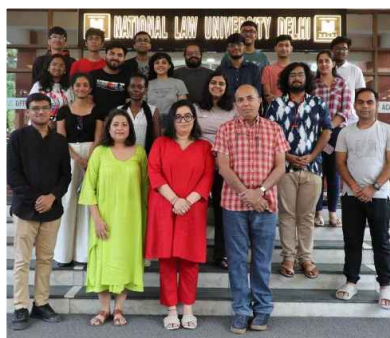

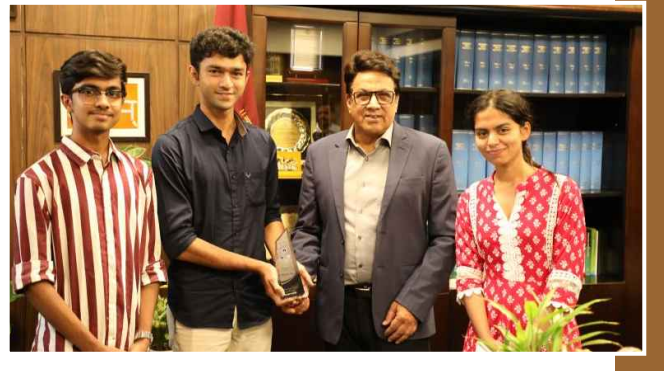
2. 10th National Law School - National Mediation Competition (July 13, 2024)

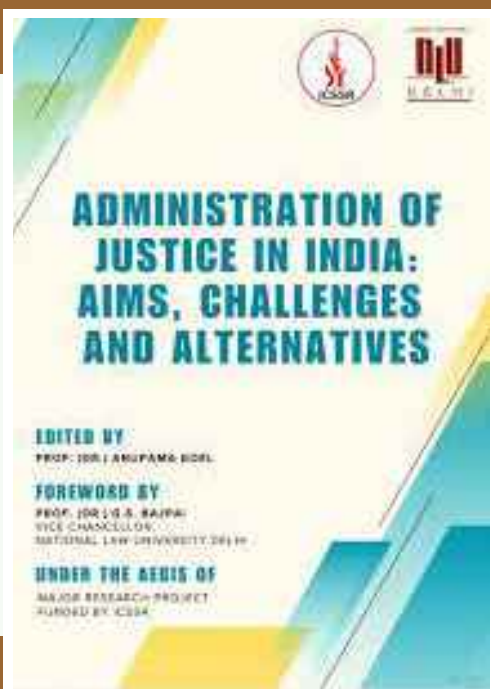
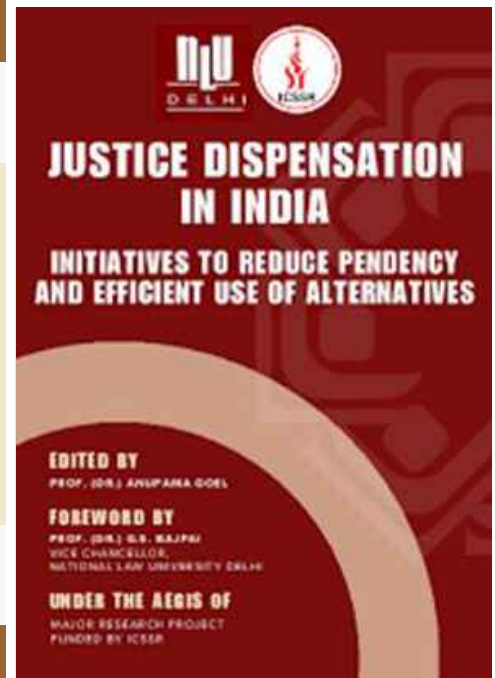
VII. Kairos

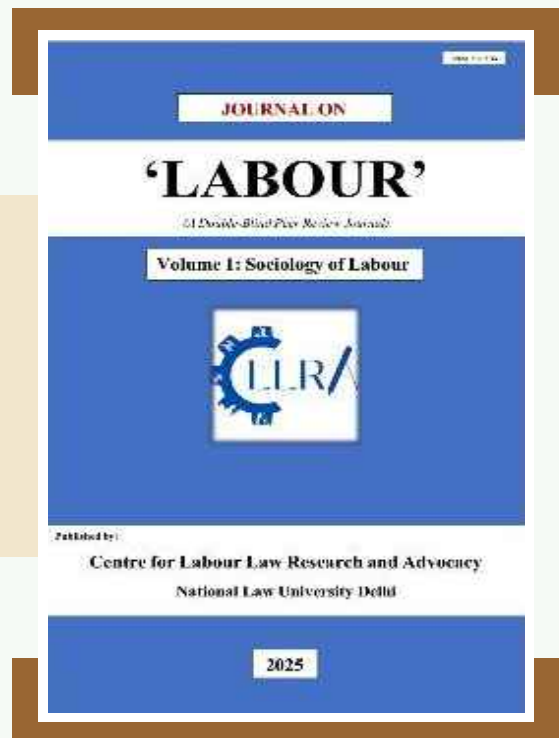


10. Indian Journal of Criminology

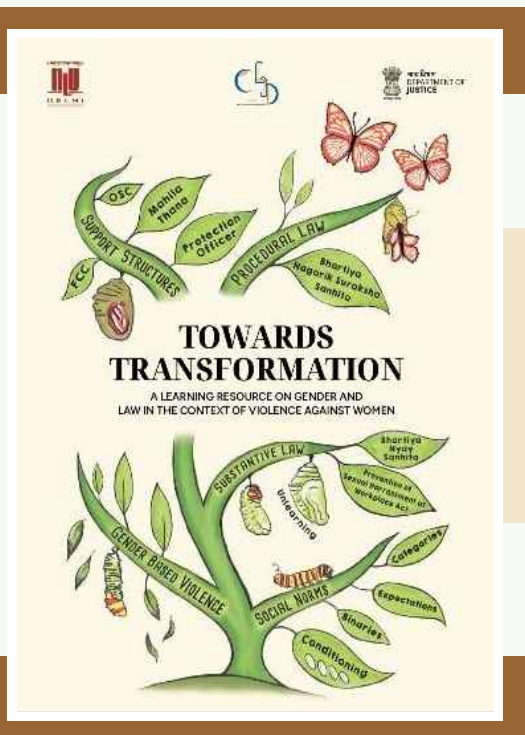


12. Compendium on Global Artificial Intelligence Laws and Regulations by Dr. Aparajita Bhatt.

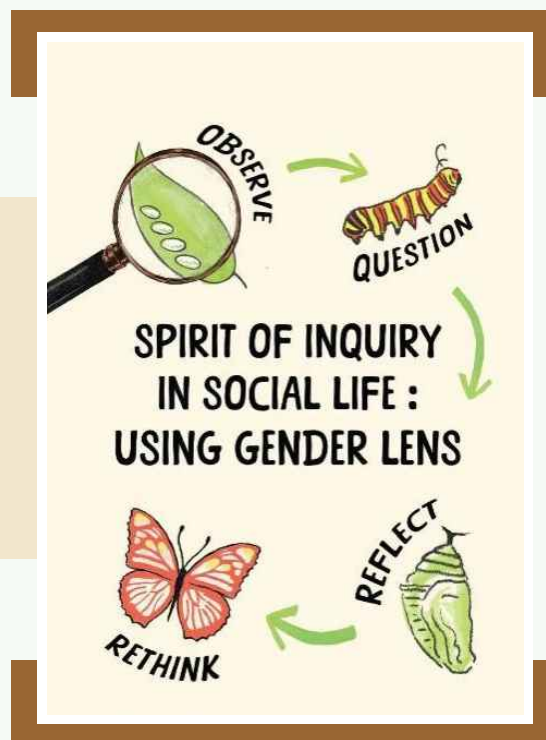


14. Towards Transformation A Learning Resource on Gender and Law in the Context of Violence Against Women By Dr. Amita Punj

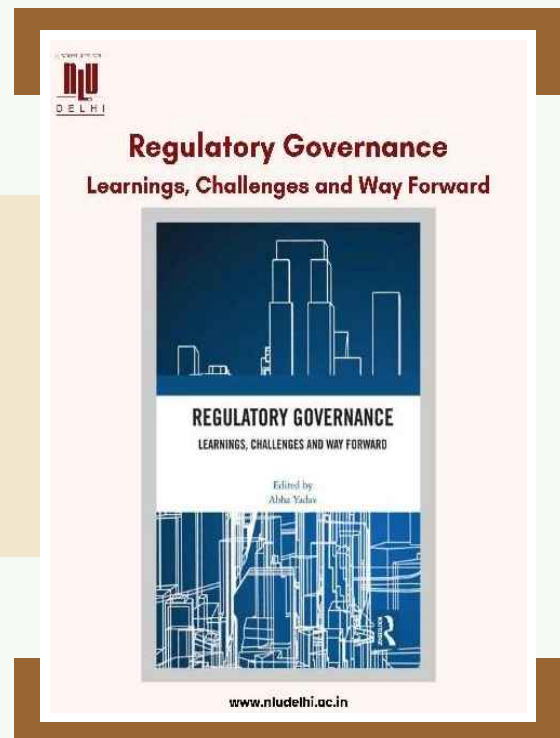

The TPS Chawla Library is stocked with major legal scholarship and research works, works on legal theories, legal manuals, state/ central government reports, NGO's reports and archival manuscripts/documents. Currently, the library has a collection of over 50,000 print documents, more than 26,000 eBooks, 9,800 e- Journals and 23 comprehensive electronic databases covering law and social development resources. The library visualises more than 13,000 digital collections of books & reports published by NLUD Press, Newspaper Clippings theses, Dissertations (LLM), Govt Reports and an archival collection of ebooks through VIDHI GYAN SANGRAH: an institutional repository at NLUD. Recently, Justice T.P.S. Chawla Library added to its repository access to digital newspapers by subscribing to the leading daily The Hindu and The Financial newspaper, The Hindu Businessline. Both ePapers can be accessed by the faculty and the student body alike. The library also has subscriptions to prominent digital portals such as LiveLaw and Bar & Bench, which pertain to legal news, information, debates and discussions. Justice T.P.S. Chawla Library aims to support teaching, research and scholarships by serving as a rich source of valuable knowledge. It strives to provide information not only through traditional means but also through the latest technological mediums.



Internet/Computer Centre

The campus is wi-fi (wireless friendly) enabled. The internet centre is located in the Library and has 20 high end desktops with Microsoft operating system and well equipped with optical drives. Besides this a separate bay is also provided for laptop users. The internet centre is supported with three servers and with a high speed bandwidth, centrally document & print facility is also available.

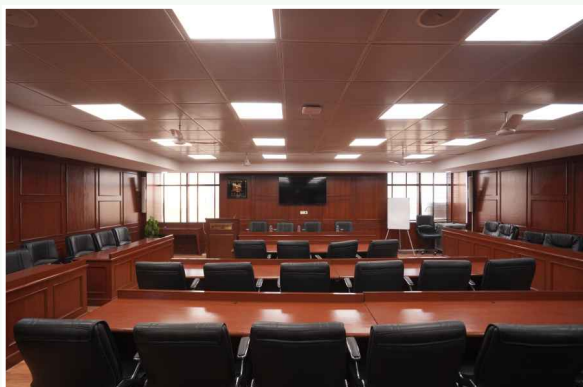
Digital Classroom

Our classrooms are well equipped with interactive touch panel, digital podiums, LCD projector & display screen and internet (wi-fi) access. The students are required to purchase laptops for making best use of internet connectivity for research purposes. All the classrooms have e-Station Smart Multimedia Podium for teaching. The e-Station is equipped with the facilities of touch screen, writing, sound system, visualizer, CD player and recording etc.



Auditorium

The auditorium is used for organizing University functions including seminars, conferences and cultural programs.

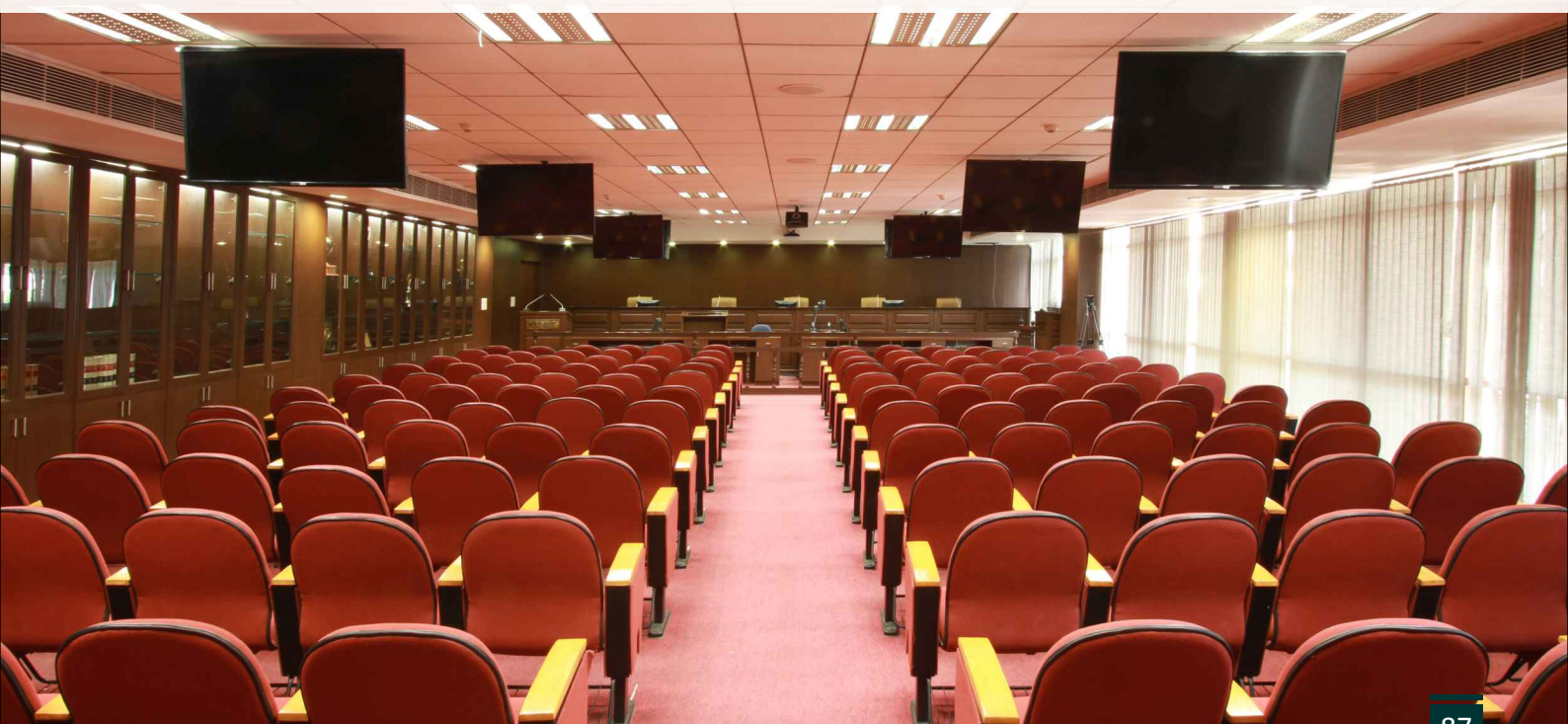


Seminar Rooms

NLU Delhi has four Conference/Seminar rooms furnished with ultra-modern AV facilities, located at various floors of the Academic Block in the University. These are available for booking after due notice for various events intended towards students, faculty and administration, along with external events.

Justice Y.K. Sabharwal Moot Court Hall

The University has a pioneering e-Moot Court Hall equipped with the latest up-to-date hi-tech audio visual equipment having a seating capacity of 156 people. Students studying here are habituated to real life like legal scenarios, for acquainting them with mootng through organizing, attending and participating in practice moot court and competition.



INFRASTRUCTURAL AMENITIES

The University has a sprawling campus at Dwarka with state of art infrastructure facilities consisting of an Academic Block (five floors), separate Halls of Residence for boys and girls (six floors), an independent administration block (five floors), a fully air-conditioned Auditorium for holding conferences and seminars. The University is fully residential and maintains separate residences for boys and girls. The Halls of Residence are provided with a common room with facilities of indoor games, like T.T & Pool, a common television and a state-of-art Gymnasium. Management and maintenance of discipline in the halls of residence is the responsibility of the residents, Chief- Warden and Wardens. The residents have to mandatorily conform to the rules and regulations of the University.

Sports/Games

The University has a basketball court, volleyball court, Table Tennis and a badminton court. Separate gymnasiums for boys and girls are available in their respective Halls of Residence, equipped with the latest equipment. More facilities for sports are planned in the additional land which will be available to the University for the purpose, shortly.



Transport Facilities

The University offers a shuttle service for pick & drop to the nearest metro station.

Medical Centre & Ambulance

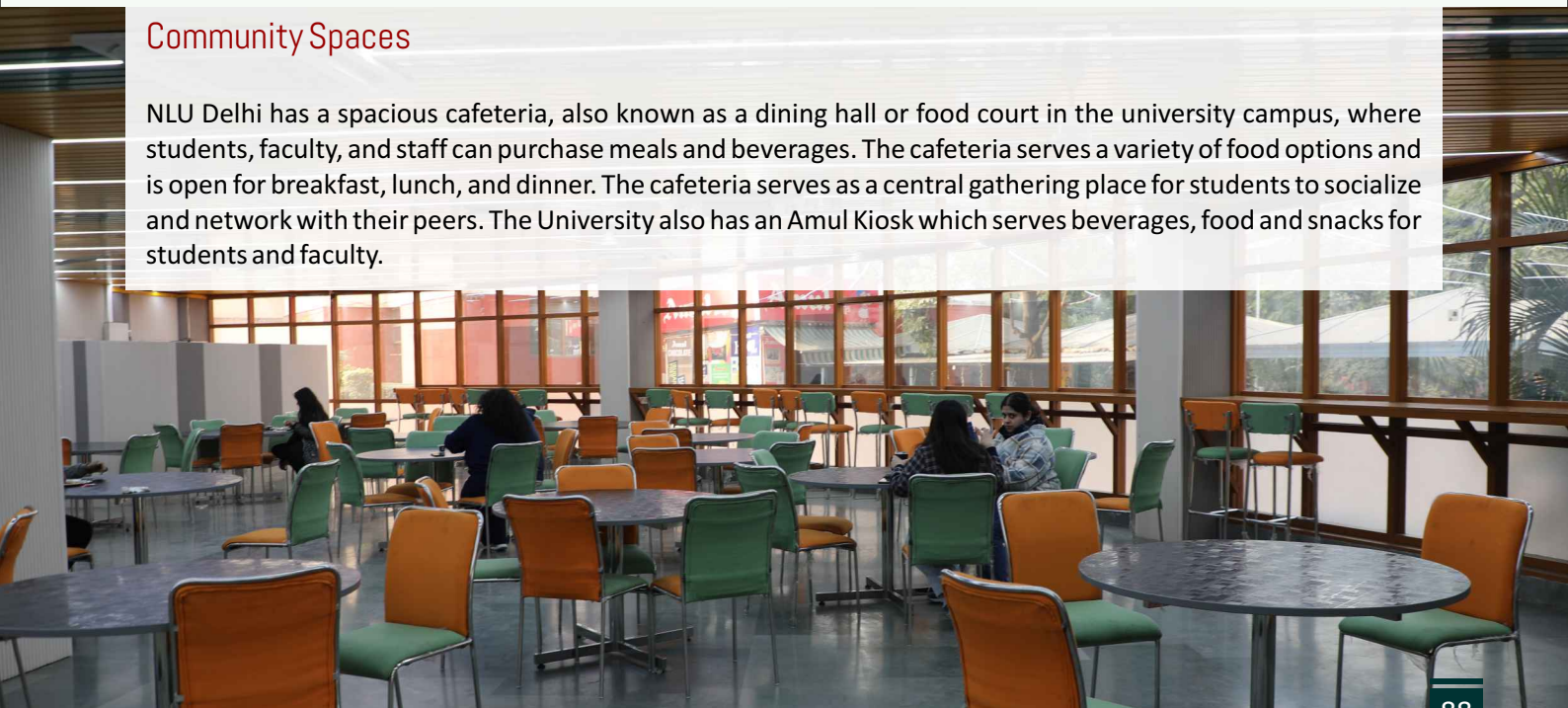
The university has a medical room with Two doctors, a Nurse and a Psychiatrist. An ambulance is available round the clock for the residents of the University to deal with any emergency situation.

Banks

NLU Delhi has banking extension facilities through UCO Bank and HDFC Bank. Students may avail banking services on demand by contacting banking authorities. The University also has an HDFC ATM machine installed in the Cafeteria.

Community Spaces

NLU Delhi has a spacious cafeteria, also known as a dining hall or food court in the university campus, where students, faculty, and staff can purchase meals and beverages. The cafeteria serves a variety of food options and is open for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. The cafeteria serves as a central gathering place for students to socialize and network with their peers. The University also has an Amul Kiosk which serves beverages, food and snacks for students and faculty.



WELL-BEING SUPPORT

Counseling Department

The Counseling Department works for the holistic well-being and mental health needs of the NLU Delhi community. It is the department's vision to provide and co-construct a framework that facilitates the well-being of the students and the employees by creating awareness about various psychological concepts, providing psychological services and sharing empirical and research-based techniques for working with everyday issues and personal growth. It is the department's endeavour to review, restructure and add to the initiatives as per the social and environmental demands as seen in the case of the pandemic. This overarching vision is implemented and achieved through Individual Counseling sessions, wherein the students can directly contact the counselors for an in-person or online session, group and individual orientation sessions for the first years, workshops and discussion sessions where various psychological themes and management techniques are discussed. Drafting Mental Health booklets, facilitating peer interaction through various activities and initiatives.



The department runs under the guidance of two Mental Health Counsellors at present and initiatives have been taken to expand the team. The counsellors have an eclectic approach whereby they facilitate therapeutic modules as per students' needs & concerns.

In addition to individual counselling services, the department has also put forth a proposal to establish a mental wellbeing corner within the campus. It is being curated as a community space emphasizing on the importance & awareness of Mental Health with a wide range of sources available in the form of grounding tools such as self-help books, stimulating toys, picture books; co-regulation tools like board games, art supplies, mindfulness-based activities, to promote a non-judgemental, agency-building & supportive environment as Healing does not happen in isolation!

YourDOST Counseling Services

NLU Delhi entered into a partnership with YourDOST-a counseling and emotional support, technology platform, designed to foster mental health. It anonymously connects individuals with the right experts, consisting of psychologists, psychotherapists, counselors, life coaches, career counselors who understand and can guide individuals through completely confidential one on one sessions. It is capable of providing counseling through web and mobile platforms.

NLU Delhi helps manage the well-being of its campus community through this platform. It is accessible to NLU Delhi students, faculty members and staff that come from a diverse range of countries, regions, cultures, socioeconomic backgrounds, age groups, religions, interests, etc



STUDENT COMMUNITIES

Gender Circle

The Gender Circle has played a prominent role in breaking gender stereotypes and creating gender sensitization on campus through various formal and informal interactive events, guest lectures and panel discussions

Cinema Club

The Cinema Club is a gateway to world cinema, exploring myriad themes to inculcate art appreciation and creative thinking. It provides a platform for discussions on many contemporary and relevant themes. The Cinema Club organises a movie screening every Monday at 9 PM. The movies include a wide variety including documentaries, world cinema, critically acclaimed movies etc.

Enable

Enable is a student group dedicated towards providing support to the students with disabilities by making everyday life more accessible. The group seeks to spread awareness and sensitize members of the University to the problems faced by the students with disabilities and how the same can be addressed.

Legal Aid

The University, through the Legal Services Committee, has been involved in fostering legal aid and awareness. The University has established a fully functional Legal Aid Clinic and the Clinic for Assistance in Labour Laws (CALL) - an initiative to bridge the chasm between workers and the legal machinery, by providing access to quality legal aid. As a part of the HSF Community Engagement Awards, the initiative was selected as one of the five best legal aid initiatives in India. The University, through the Committee, has also constituted a pro-bono panel of practicing lawyers who help the committee in its legal interventions.

Ambedkar Periyar Phule Study Circle

This is a student-led initiative extending support in academics to marginalized students in the University, especially those who are unable to utilize academic opportunities due to various social barriers and constraints. It also acts as a platform for discussion and debate on the issues of social justice, gender, caste, race and other contemporary issues in India through guest lectures, panel discussions and movie screenings.



Engage

A student group geared towards encouraging a culture of thought and discourse on campus. This initiative lays equal emphasis on University issues and the broader socio-political, economic, and cultural issues. The topics for discussion are usually related to harassment and discrimination, attendance and academic performance, mental health, student governance, administrative transparency, etc. Engage intends to facilitate effective dialogue between various stakeholders starting with the students, faculty and the administration.

Queer Collective

The Queer Collective is an independent student collective campus. It has been involved in creating awareness on issues surrounding LGBTQIA+ rights through poster campaigns, movie screenings and discussion groups. It has invited speakers belonging to the LGBTQIA+ community to interact with students, and has participated in the Delhi Queer Pride Parade as well.

Philosophy Club

Under the supervision of Professor Maheshwar Singh, the Batch of 2025 has created the Philosophy Club to spread an appreciation for philosophy within the University and law schools in general. The club conducts various discussions on a host of fundamental philosophical texts and ideas, hosted lecture series by leading academics, disseminated easily accessible learning resources and notes, and much more. They also publish an Annual Newsletter, which contains a report of their activities and the best articles they received as entry submissions to their Blog.

STUDY AT NLU DELHI

DEGREES OFFERED THROUGH AILET

National Law University Delhi has five flagship programmes; B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Programme, LL.M. Programme, IP - Joint Masters/LL.M. Programme, PGIP – MA/LLM (Insolvency Programme) and Ph.D. Programme. Admission to these programmes are gained through merit by appearing in the All India Law Entrance Test - AILET - which is held on a pan India basis annually.

1. Undergraduate Programme [B.A.LL.B. (Hons.)]

The five-year integrated B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Degree Programme is the flagship course of NLU Delhi. This is a comprehensive interdisciplinary law degree that is aimed at building a strong foundation of law along with an all-round socio-political and economic understanding. Admission to the course is on the basis of merit as assessed through the All India Law Entrance Test (AILET), conducted annually. In order to be eligible for the course, the students must have completed senior secondary (Class 12th) education in any stream. After the completion of the course, students are equipped for professional or academic pursuits.

2. B.A. LL.B. (SPECIALISED HONS.) PROGRAM:

With its commitment to strive towards achieving excellence, the university also offer an option to the students to opt for a specialized degree of B.A.LL.B (Hons.) in the following specialised areas –

- (i) Business Law
- (ii) Criminal Law
- (iii) International Law and
- (iv) Intellectual Property Law

The University will offer more specializations in the upcoming years.

3. Post-graduate Programme [LL.M. Programme]

The LL.M. Degree programme is aimed at developing a deeper and focused understanding in the area of specialization. To be eligible for admission to the LL.M. programme, a candidate should have passed the LL.B. or an equivalent degree from a recognized university, with not less than 50% marks on aggregate (45% in case of SC/ST/Persons with Disability category). Admission is on the basis of merit as assessed through the AILET. The programme is designed to inculcate research skills and analytical abilities. At the end of the final semester, students have to compulsorily submit a dissertation on the topic of their choice. This degree equips the students to pursue a career in academic, research, legal practice, and administrative & judicial service.

4. Post-graduate Programme [IP - Joint Masters/LL.M.]

The Joint Masters/ LL.M. in Intellectual Property (IP) Law and Management has been launched in pursuance of the tripartite Letter of Intent signed between the National Law University Delhi (NLUD) with the World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO) and the Office of Controller General of Patents Designs and Trade Marks (CGPDTM - Indian IP Office), Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India under the aegis of WIPO India Action Plan, 2023.

The Foreign National and OCI/PIO Candidates are also required to apply online on the admission portal.

Courses Offered :

- a.) LL.M (One year) Non - Residential Programmer course, Candidates should have completed LL.B. or an equivalent degree from a recognized University with minimum of 55% marks in aggregate (50% for

reserved categories such as SC/ST/Persons with disability). Candidates appearing for the final year LL.B. annual examination in 2025 are eligible to apply.

- b.) Master of Arts (M.A.) in Intellectual Property Law and Management course, Candidates should have completed LL.B. or an equivalent degree from a recognized university with minimum of 55% marks in aggregate (50% for reserved categories such as SC/ST/Person with disability). Candidates appearing for the final year LL.B. annual examination in 2025 are eligible to apply.

The degree granting authority for this programme is National Law University Delhi. However, the transcript / degree certificate shall bear the logos of all the partnering institutions.

5. Postgraduate Insolvency Program (PGIP) – Master of Arts (MA)/ Masters of Laws (LLM) Degree in Insolvency

About the Programme: The 2-Year Post Graduate Insolvency Program (PGIP), recognised by the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India and Master of Arts (MA) / Master of Laws (LLM) Degree in Insolvency has been launched by the National Law University Delhi (NLUD).

Admission Process:

All candidates seeking admission to this program must appear for the All India Entrance Test (AIET).

Program Highlights:

This specialized 2-year degree program offers a streamlined path to becoming an Insolvency Professional (IP) under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) 2016.

The program addresses the professional experience requirement mandated by the IBC — reducing the typical requirement of 10 or 15 years to just 2 years through this structured academic route.

While the degree is awarded by NLUD and the PGIP certification is recognised by the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India.

Post-Completion Benefits:

According to the **Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (Insolvency Professionals) Regulations of 2016** (Amended up to 18-09-2023), under Chapter III, Regulation 5:

Subject to the other provisions of these regulations, an individual shall be eligible for registration, if he (c) has- (ii) successfully completed the [Post] Graduate Insolvency Program, as may approved by the Board; Upon successfully completing the 2-year **Post Graduate Insolvency Program (PGIP)- Master of Arts (MA) Master of Laws (LLM) Degree in Insolvency** program and passing the **Limited Insolvency Examination**, candidates will become eligible for registration as **Insolvency Professionals** without the need to accumulate the previously required **10 years of professional experience**.

Eligibility

Candidates who have completed a basic professional course such as company secretary, chartered accountancy, cost accountancy, or law, or bachelor's in technology or bachelor's in engineering or a post-graduate with a major in Economics, Finance, Commerce, Management or Insolvency with aggregate 50% marks. The total number of seats for the program is 40.

*Disclaimer: The eligibility for the Master of Laws (LLM) degree is completion of their LLB, all other candidates will be eligible for Master of Arts (MA) degree.

6. Doctoral Programme [Ph.D.]

NLU Delhi's doctoral programme is a research-intensive programme designed for post-graduate students and equips them for careers in scholarship and teaching. As a university policy, NLU Delhi, encourages multidisciplinary research, thus, students can do research in law or related subjects through the interdisciplinary perspectives of social sciences or humanities. The aim of the programme is to produce a substantial body of work that adds value to the academic field while enabling the students to become independent researchers and scholars in their respective fields.

Diploma, Executive Diploma & Certificate Courses and Fellowships

L2Pro Master Classes

The Centre for Innovation, Intellectual Property and Competition (CIIPC) in collaboration with the IPR Chair at NLU Delhi and Cell for IPR Promotion and Management (CIPAM), Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce and Industry started a series of Master Classes on Introduction to L2Pro E-Learning Platform for IPR Training and Awareness. The online Master Classes are aimed at raising awareness regarding intellectual property rights amongst students and preparing them to navigate the L2Pro platform, its content and assessments. The course is being offered to all Indian university students across disciplines.

Diploma Course in Insolvency and Bankruptcy: Law, Practice, Regulations

The Centre for Transnational Commercial Law (CTCL) launched its flagship Diploma in Insolvency and Bankruptcy: Law, Practice, Regulations (DIB). This course aims to provide an exposure and in-depth understanding of law, practice and regulations of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016, to government officials, policy makers, working professionals, practitioners in legal, secretarial, accountancy, academics and researchers. The course focuses on juxtaposition of the practical aspects, legal principles and propositions within the realm of business and entrepreneurship with development of cumulative and comprehensive understanding of insolvency laws. The course also aims to acquaint and equip the participants with the practical skills relevant to insolvency laws in the courts and tribunals in India along with the requisite negotiation and problem-solving skills.

Post Graduate Diploma in Urban Environmental Management and Law

NLU Delhi and WWF India together offer a Post Graduate Diploma in Urban Environmental Management and Law (PGDUEML) which is a specialized course that focuses on strengthening the delivery capacity of urban administrators and environment professionals. PGDUEML is designed to provide in-depth knowledge and understanding of existing urban laws, by-laws and policies. The course seeks to equip its participants to tackle the loopholes in the present institutional mechanisms and to propose innovative changes. The course is intended towards the training and capacity building of all those persons concerned with and involved in improving living conditions and quality of life for urban citizens in various capacities by providing them with policy prescriptions, innovations for better urban governance, information and training inputs. It aims to strengthen the human resource pool by creating efficient urban managers.

Post Graduate Diploma in Environmental Law and Policy

With an aim to provide a better understanding of green law issues poignant worldwide, particularly in the Indian context, NLU Delhi and WWF India jointly offer a one-year Post Graduate Diploma in Environmental Law and Policy. The exclusive tailor-made programme provides opportunities for law graduates and other professionals working in the field of environment to enrich their understanding of the issues, institutions and initiatives in the field of environmental law and policy. It will provide comprehensive knowledge to participants in Environmental Law and Policy and also increase their understanding on key issues related to national as well as international environmental law & policies and help develop practical skills to facilitate effective engagement with Environmental Laws.

ALL INDIA LAW ENTRANCE TEST

All India Law Entrance Test (AILET) for admission to the B.A.LL.B. (Hons.), LL.M., LL.M IP/Joint Master, PGIP – Master of Arts (MA)/ Master of Laws (LL.M.) Degree in Insolvency and Ph.D. at the National Law University Delhi, is conducted annually in December. Entrance Exam Fee for all five Programmes is as under.

RESERVATION POLICY

1. Scheduled Castes (15%) and Scheduled Tribes (7.5%) Categories

In order to claim reservation under these categories, the candidate must have a valid certificate issued by the competent authorities. Any unfilled seat(s) reserved for Scheduled Castes (SC) will be converted to Scheduled Tribes (ST) and vice-versa and will not be offered to any other reserved category. In case sufficient number of eligible candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are not available in the respective category, the seats thus remaining vacant will be treated as General and will be offered to the General Category candidates in order of merit. A list of approved Competent Authorities for the issuance of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes certificates is as follows:

- District Magistrate, Additional District Magistrate, Deputy Commissioner, Collector, Additional Deputy Commissioner, Deputy Collector, 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate, City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate), Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Taluk Magistrate, Executive Magistrate and Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- Chief Presidency Magistrate, Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate and Presidency Magistrate.
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar;
- Administrator, Secretary to the Administrator or the Development Officer (Lakshadweep & Minicoy Islands).

2. Other Backward Classes (OBCs)-Non-Creamy Layer (22%)

A total of 22% seats are reserved for OBCs (Non-Creamy Layer) Category. The candidate possessing a valid OBC (Non-Creamy Layer) certificate issued by the competent authority under the Central List of OBCs or under the Delhi State List of OBCs (Notified by the Government of NCT of Delhi) will be eligible to apply under this category. The non-creamy layer certificate should be issued on or after 1st April 2023. A list of approved Competent authorities for the issuance of OBC certificates is as under:

- District Magistrate, Additional District Magistrate, Deputy Commissioner, Collector, Additional Deputy Commissioner, Deputy Collector, 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate, City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate), Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Executive Magistrate.

- Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and
- Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

3. Economically Weaker Section-EWS (10%)

A total of 10% seats are reserved for the Economically Weaker Section (EWS). The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of a valid Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued by any one of the following authority shall only be accepted as proof of the candidate's claim as belonging to EWS:

- District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.
- The EWS certificate should be issued on or after 1st April 2023.

4. Persons with Disabilities (PWD) 5% horizontal reservation

Horizontal reservation of 5% has been provided to the candidates belonging to Persons with Disabilities (PwD) category in accordance with the provisions of "The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016". The candidates possessing a valid PwD certificate issued by the competent authority as per the provisions of "The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 will be eligible to apply under this category.

5. 5% Horizontal Reservation across the categories has been provided to the PwD Category candidate.


