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From the Vice Chancellor's Desk

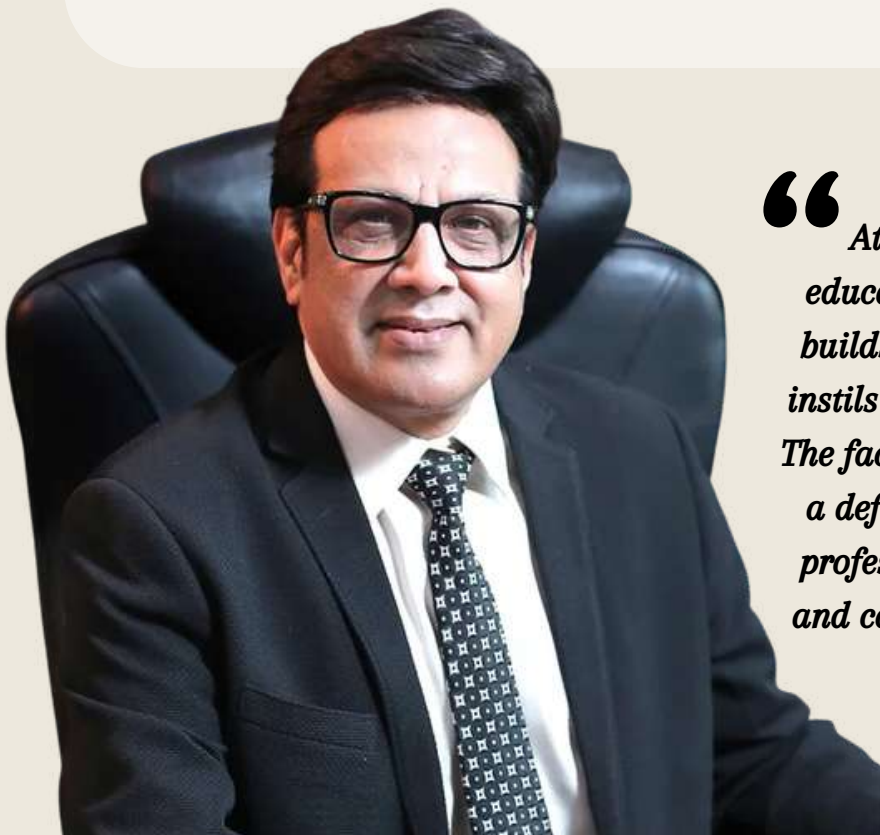

Batch of 2027 is Profession-Ready

Every student in the Batch of 2027 completes a structured pre-placement training programme delivered by practising lawyers with direct law firm experience. The programme addresses what firms expect of new joiners from day one, across three interconnected areas.

Law Firm Ethics, Etiquette, and Professional Conduct

Students undergo dedicated training on the professional norms that govern law firm environments. Core modules cover email and written communication, client correspondence protocols, reporting work product with proper context, managing multiple assignments, owning and escalating mistakes, anticipating the needs of supervising lawyers, and conducting oneself appropriately in meetings and client-facing situations. Confidentiality obligations, conflict awareness, and professional ethics under bar council norms are addressed as foundational commitments, not afterthoughts.

The objective is to ensure that students arrive at a firm already calibrated to its culture, rather than acquiring these habits through costly trial and error in their first year.

Practice Area Familiarisation

Students receive practitioner-led orientation across core areas including corporate and M&A, dispute resolution, banking and finance, insolvency and restructuring, intellectual property, and taxation. Sessions are delivered from a transactional and advisory standpoint, covering the nature of work, supervising lawyer expectations, and the pace of a live practice.

Mock Interview Programme

Each student participates in structured mock interviews conducted by practising lawyers, replicating competency-based, behavioural, and practice area-specific formats. Individual feedback is provided on substance, articulation, and presentation before recruitment season commences.

The result: students who integrate faster, make fewer early-stage missteps, and demonstrate a cultural fit that reduces attrition from the outset.

Recruitment Process



Step 1: Pre-Placement Talks

- Recruiters are encouraged to conduct pre-placement talks for interested students in the university providing important information, such as the profile of the organization, career prospects, compensation packages, etc.
- These pre-placement talks can be conducted at any time before the pre-interview screening.
- Recruiters may also choose to share PPTs, or any other document, with the RCC for efficient circulation with the candidates

Step 2: Coordination & Logistics

- The RCC shall appoint a Point of Contact (PoC) for each recruiter interested in being a part of the recruitment process.
- The PoC shall ensure that all the logistical needs of recruiters are efficiently met for optimum coordination between the recruiters and the RCC.
- The PoC shall coordinate with the recruiters on the scheduling, catering, and hospitality of all interviewers representing the recruiters in the recruitment process.

Step 3: Pre-Interview Screening Process

- Recruiters may conduct a pre-interview screening process any time before the interview day.
- Recruiters are free to determine their policy for the screening process to shortlisted students.
- In case the recruiter has no particular method of pre-interview screening, the curricula vitae of the interested students shall be forwarded to the recruiter.
- After the completion of the pre-interview screening, the recruiter shall formulate a final Interview list which shall be communicated by the recruiter to the RCC at least 48 hours prior to the interview day along with a waitlist of students.
- In case any applicant who is selected in the final interview list is not available for the interview then the recruiter can interview the waitlist candidates instead, if the recruiter considers this appropriate.

- In case the recruiter has no procedure for pre-interview screening, the list of interested students shall automatically become the final interview list.
- These pre-placement talks can be conducted at any time before the pre-interview screening.
- Recruiters may also choose to share PPTs, or any other document, with the RCC for efficient circulation with the candidates

Step 4: Interview Process & Results

- All interviews being conducted on the same day may be conducted in different time slots.
- Notwithstanding the foregoing, RCC shall declare all results simultaneously at the end of the day, or as deemed fit by the RCC, to ensure no recruiter is prejudiced.
- The recruiters will be required to disclose the results of their final interviews and any offer made to applicants only through the RCC, which will be communicated in a sealed envelope or via mail.
- Every offer made by the recruiter will be communicated solely by the RCC to the applicant to whom such offer is made.
- The RCC will revert to the recruiter within 24 hours of receiving the sealed envelope containing the merit list and the offer waitlist.
- At no point in time will there be any communication between the recruiter and the applicants in relation to the offer.
- The RCC is the only authorized body to approach and communicate with the recruiters in relation to any recruitment process involving the Batch of 2026 at NLUD.
- The decision of the RCC regarding the selection of candidates at any stage of the recruitment process shall be final and binding upon all the parties involved therein.
- The recruiters are requested not to encourage any personal communication made by any applicants

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
